WHO IS A REFUGEE?

Someone who has had to escape from serious persecution in their country of origin, and who couldn't get protection there.

People seeking refugee protection in the UK at the moment come from very dangerous or oppressive countries like Iran and Syria.

Someone who has asked the UK government for this protection, and is waiting for a decision, is called an 'asylum seeker'.

THE TRUTH ABOUT ASYLUM SEEKERS

Asylum seekers are ordinary people in an extraordinary situation. They don't get lots of benefits – adults get a maximum of £36.62 pw. They are not allowed to work, or to get council housing, and have to report to a police station regularly.

Despite these restrictions, asylum seekers in Bristol try hard to be part of our community, and are proud to invite you to the events we've organised.
